So, I found great peace through simply committing myself to staying here in Biloxi no matter what may come.

In other news, I planted several trees in my yard to replace several that were damaged in the storm. I have a Red Maple and a Magnolia in my front yard, and a Live Oak in my back yard. These stately trees are a fixture along the Coast, and many here are hundreds of years old.
